Survey questions aimed to evaluate programme outcomes and the Wā Kāinga programme extension to Kiwi Can and Stars Teina.

What did the ākonga learn?



96% of teachers said the programme helped to improve student behaviour.



99% of the teachers said the programme helped to improve student attitudes.



97% of teachers said the programme had a positive impact on student engagement in learning.

Teacher satisfaction with the programme...



99% of teachers were satisfied the programme was delivered in a culturally responsive way.



97% of teachers were satisfied with the organisation and delivery of the programme in their school.

Wā Kāinga

Wā Kāinga is underpinned by kaupapa Māori learning philosophies and taught using experiential localised inquiry learning. This programme extension to Kiwi Can and Stars Teina allows ākonga to explore how they connect with their community and wider world around them. It strengthens their understanding of whakapapa, local history, Te Reo and culture.

Teacher satisfaction with Wā Kāinga..



94% of teachers said they were satisfied with ākonga engagement.



88% of teachers said they were satisfied with learning outcomes for their ākonga.



Three-quarters of teachers were satisfied with the use of Te Reo Māori.



85% of teachers said they were satisfied with how Wā Kāinga complemented learning in the classroom.

Reducing barriers for learners...



Three-quarters of teachers said that the programme was helping to reduce barriers for learners, such as supporting neurodiverse ākonga with adapted delivery, resources, or by forming positive bonds and fostering peer relationships.
